Virtual Money

If you've played Fortnite or Roblox, or any popular mobile game, you probably received something special to spend. V-bucks, Robux, Crystals, Gems, or Coins, they all work the same - they're VIRTUAL MONEY. Virtual money is a way to spend real money to buy items to use in a game.

It's like dressing up your dollars for Halloween! And like Halloween – if you aren't careful – things can get scary!

HOW DOES VIRTUAL MONEY WORK?

First, you connect a debit card (which takes money directly from your checking or savings account) or credit card (which lets you borrow money a little bit at a time). Apps like Zelle, CashApp,

and Venmo already connect to checking account or your debit/credit card and work the same. You then spend that real money to buy some virtual money.



... But why does virtual money come in different amounts from real money?

PLAYING DRESS UP

Virtual money is used for buying new characters, items, music, emotes, and more. Items you buy in a game that don't change how it plays are called COSMETICS. These might include outfits or even appearances for your character called SKINS. Most people don't mind, as they are fun ways to express yourself and the things you like.

Early in the days of virtual money, players could buy powerful items in games that made it easier to succeed. In competitive games, you would need to spend money to keep up or else lose more often! "Pay-to-win" made virtual money feel like a scam!

Some game publishers also included "LOOT BOXES." Virtual money was spent to buy a loot box which contained random rewards – like a pack of cards for a card game. Lawmakers pointed out that this was a lot like gambling, and was often used to trick players into spending more money than they wanted to!

A TRICK WITH YOUR TREAT

So why can't 1 V-Buck equal 1 dollar? To make it easier to forget how much you are spending! Companies use tricky

features like virtual money and loot boxes, to hide how much money things really cost. The "fear of missing out (FOMO)" and wanting to play games with your friends and have the coolest new items is strong! Game companies use FOMO to push you to spend more!

DON'T SAY "BOO" JUST YET...

So is virtual money bad? It doesn't have to be! Like anything that has to do with money, you need to set a BUDGET. Look at what you need to buy each month, how much money you earn, and decide what amount you can spend on in-app



purchases. If you don't play a game often, it isn't worth it to buy any of their virtual money. And if you are excited about a game, buy only enough virtual money to get the items you want.
